### **Environmental Regeneration Manager**

Boleskine seeks a new volunteer to join our existing and ambitious team. We are a Scottish registered charity which is regulated by the OSCR.

#### **Job description**

We have a vacancy to appoint an Environmental Regeneration Manager to the volunteer team at Boleskine.

To apply for this role you need to have the following:

- ❖ An educational and/or professional background in environmental science or conservation
- ❖ A passion for understanding and protecting the environment
- ❖ The ability to communicate with a wide range of people
- ❖ 1-3 years of project management experience (preferred but not essential)
- ❖ Strong influencing skills to sell our project and help with fundraising
- ❖ A collaborative mindset

#### **What will I be doing?**

The Boleskine project aims to create a resilient and vibrant landscape that will help to restore the balance and protect our environmental future. Our vision is that nature thrives alongside heritage, protecting both our built and natural environment. Lowering the carbon footprint of the building and the estate is also central to our vision.

The projects you could be working on include:

- ❖ Designing and managing our new wildflower initiative
- ❖ Reintroducing native plant species and managing the removal of invasive plant species
- ❖ Tree planting and tree regeneration
- ❖ Designing, managing and fundraising for a large pond restoration project

- ❖ Managing initiatives to support our local red squirrel population
- ❖ Managing initiatives to enhance and grow the population of protected species living on the estate
- ❖ Running educational and community events to educate the public and to support wider environmental regeneration in the local area

Funds would be allocated to various projects and you would work closely with our existing marketing and fundraising team to raise funds for the projects. You would also work closely with our Financial Controller to manage budgets for our projects. We would welcome and encourage the successful candidate to actively contribute their own ideas for the estate in collaboration with and under the supervision of the Trustees.

Most likely you will work on one major project at a time. You'll start by carefully planning what is going to be reintroduced and where. Working alongside conservation, environmental and wildlife experts, you will design a landscape that will work in harmony with the existent or original environment.

This planning stage may involve carrying out a scientific study of species, to test their suitability for this project.

You will then need to supervise the work as it begins and monitor how the new environment is responding and growing, making changes if necessary. You will collect and analyse data from the new habitats created.
